Have you made your reservations for the Ranger Rendezvous (1993) at Columbus/Ft. Benning, GA? The active duty 75th Ranger Regiment is hosting this years Rendezvous. Many of the events that occured last year at the National Reunion and Ranger Rendezvous will take place again. P/75 and N/75 - 74th LRP - 173rd LRRP will be holding a off year reunion in conjunction with the rendezvous. addition to the events listed below, the Ranger Training Brigade (LRS Training Section) will conduct the dedication of the LRSU classroom in Lazslo Rabel's name. RANGER ASSOCIATIONS

For the past year there seems to be some confusion among the members of all the RANGER ASSOCIATIONS on who is eligible for membership in the 7 different Ranger Associations. That's right "7"! Listed below are the various Ranger Associations and the criteria for joining. Each is a separate entity and this article in no way attempts to explain the various classes of membership in the other associations:

75th Ranger Regiment Association Inc. (This Association)

Membership is open to all former members of the 15 Ranger Companies that existed during the Vietnam Era as well as the LRP companies and detachments who preceded them and the LRRP units who existed prior to the the LRP units, members who served with 1st and 2nd Bn 75th Infantry (Ranger) and the Hq's and three (3) active duty Ranger Battalions of the present Regiment. In addition the former members of the V Corps and 7th Corp LURP's and their successor units are eligible for membership. Membership is contingent upon verification of service in one of the above qualifying units.

Merrill's Marauders (WWII)

Service in 5307th Composite Unit or 475th Infantry who served in the Burma Theater of Operations/

Ranger Battalions Association (WWII)

Service in one of the 6 Ranger Battalions that served in the European Theater of Operations or Pacific Theater of Operations.

Ranger Infantry Companies Airborne (Korea)

Service in one of the Ranger Companies that existed during the Korean era.

Army Ranger Association (No specific period of service)

Graduate of the US Army Ranger School and other classes of membership.

75th Ranger Association (Active Duty Regiment)

Regular membership - must be currently serving in one of the three battalions of the active regiment. Associate Membership -Have served with any Ranger type unit. This association was formed primarily to handle funds so that they would not have to constantly ask the existing associations for moneys.

Ranger Training Brigade (Ranger Instructors)

The newest of all the associations. Unsure of qualifications for membership other than to have served as a Ranger Instructor.

There are other Ranger type associations such as the 8th Army Ranger Company (Korea) or G/75th Rangers who restrict membership to having served in the respective units. Some of our members as well as the other associations members get the various associations confused, some send moneys for membership in organizations that they are not eligible for or think they are getting a life membership in our association when they are actually getting a life membership as an associate member in the 75th Ranger Association. Don't know a solution except to ensure that you are member of the 75th Ranger

Regiment Association. (THIS ASSOCIATION)

VIET NAM RANGER RECOGNITION REQUEST

- 1. The purpose of this memorandum is to officially request that either by proclamation or decree that the Army recognize the Vietnam era Rangers as honorary Rangers with the equivalent status as all other U.S. Army Rangers
- 2. As part of an historical oversight, the Vietnam Era Rangers have not been officially recognized. As you know, their contributions to both our Army and Nation are a matter of historical record many written in Ranger blood. The intent is to recognize the contributions of these heroic individuals as well as their units as U.S. Army Rangers.
- 3. The requested units to be recognized are the U.S. Advisors that assisted Ranger units (Biet Dong Quan BDQ) of the Army of the Republic of Vietnam (ARVN) and Long Range Patrol (LRP) / Long Range Reconnaissance Patrol Companies/Detachments that served in the Republic of Vietnam prior to 1 February 1969. After this date the Ranger LRP/LRRP Companies are recognized.
- 4. By way of historical perspective, on 1 February 1969, the 75th Infantry (Rangers) was activated and all of the LRP and LRRP companies became lettered Ranger Companies. Their missions remained the same Patrolling deep into enemy territory and collecting intelligence was their forte. The BDQ advisors performed typical Ranger operations. The sad fact is that the men of the LRP, LRRP and BDQ advisor units are unofficially recognized by the entire Ranger community as brethren Rangers.
- 5. In the same sense that the Army officially recognize other Rangers from the past, we respectfully request that these Vietnam era Ranger receive the appropriate U.S. Army recognition. The approval of this recognition would correct both an historical oversight as well as elevate the men and units of the Vietnam era Rangers to equivalent of; Daniel Morgan, from the American Revolution. Colonel John S. Mosby a confederate Ranger from the Civil War. BG Frank Merrill from World War II, and the outstanding men and leaders of the Ranger Infantry Airborne Companies of the Korean War.
- 6. Respectfully request that this action be given just consideration in an effort to honor those veteran Rangers and units that serve our Army and Nation with such valor and distinction during the Vietnam War.

RANGERS LEAD THE WAY!

SECRETARYS NOTE: The above letter was sent thru the USA. Special Operations Command (Provisional), Ft. Bragg, NC. USA SOCOM. to the Chief of Staff. U.S. Army. Washington, DC on 6 May 1993. This letter was inspired by our association to right the inequalities that some elements have attributed to the Vietnam era RANGERS. Credit needs to be given to past president. Bob Gilbert and all of the elected officers of this association for the past 6 years. The truth of the matter is that while our brethren of

WWII and Korea had officers assigned to the various combat clements of the Rangers, we, of the Vietnam era had enlisted men in the grades of E4 thru E6 leading the RANGER/LRP/LRRP teams. The fact that the LRRP and LRP teams did not have the Title of "Ranger" led some of the officers at Department of the Army level to beleive that we were seperate entities. While that is true from a lineage viewpoint, the fact also exists that LRRP's and LRP's mission, equipment and terrain did not change just because of a unit designation change. The fact also exists that the LRRP's/LRP's performed every mission designated by the US Army to be Ranger missions. The Rangers of previous era's who were led by officers that eventually advanced to Pentagon assignments were in place to see that due recognition was given to their previous units. This editorial in no way should be taken as a slur on the Officer Corp or the Staff of the Pentagon. It is just a plausable explanation of the reasons for the historical oversight. The above letter is the result of 6 years of work by your officers and was directed by the membership at all the national membership meetings that have taken place. When the official recognition takes place, I for one, who has always felt that we who served our country proudly and with distinction have earned the title of RANGER and I will stand a little more taller, be a little more prouder whenever the LRRP's/LRP's and our brethern of the BDQ are called RANGERS! Colonel Grange is eminently qualified to be the author of this request. For those of you who are not familiar with his background, Col Grange served as Platoon Leader in Company L, 75th Infantry (Ranger) and was an Advisor to the Vietnamese Ranger Bn (BDQ) and is the current Regimental Commander of the active duty 75th Ranger Regiment. His change of command will take place in July and I am sure that the relationship we now have with the 75th Ranger Regiment will continue to one of mutual respect and admiration.

Geoffey Barker, Honorary Member #1, has sent me a copy of his revisions to A Concise History of U.S. Army Special Operations Forces. 2nd Edition, Volume 1. This book is designed to appeal to the amateur historian, the military insignia collector, and those soldiers who made it happen The book lists not only all the Ranger type units that have existed from the time of the American Revolution to the present (1993) to include the dates of activation and deactivation but includes the numerous variations of scrolls worn (Authorized & Unauthorized), Distinctive Unit Insignia, as well as a short narrative on unit awards. This edition also identifies units participating in operations URGENT FURY, JUST CAUSE, EARNEST WILL, DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM and PROVIDE COMFORT, and newly activated SOF units through to 1993. The book also includes the same information on Special Forces, Psychological Operations and Civil Affairs units. Geoffrey was kind enough to enclose a membership application for our association. The application is correct in content but lists past president Bob Gilbert as President Emeritus (for life) and that membership applications/dues are to be sent to him. Not so, dues are to be sent to the treasurer and there is no such position in our association as President for Life! Overall, I find A Concise History of U.S. Army Special Operations Forces invaluable as a amateur historian and along with Shelby Stanton's Rangers at War a tool that enhances my ability to perform my job as Secretary for our association. 
