
ASSOC. COLORS AND MEMORIAL STONE

The picture below does not do justice to the design that Duke DuShane drew up. The diagonal upper right half is blue in color, while the diagonal left lower half is red in color. The scroll showing the LRRP/LRP is white with red lettering. The Medal of Honor ribbon is directly below the LRRP/LRP scroll and the "RANGER" is in white lettering. A brown eagle holds the unit crest and is gold, blue, green, white and red.

The motto "OF THEIR OWN ACCORD" is in a scoll of white with blue lettering. The battle streamers will be attached at a later date. The colors will be on hand at the Ranger Memorial dedication. **PRESIDENT**


