WHY ATTEND A NATIONAL REUNION?

Our association holds national reunions every two years on the even numbered years 94, 96, 98 . . ., this will be the 4th national reunion since the first one in 1988. The 88 reunion was held at Columbus/Ft. Benning, the 90 reunion in Colorado Springs, the 92 reunion was scheduled for Fayetteville/Ft Bragg but was moved to Columbus/Ft Benning so we could participate in the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the RANGERS. The membership decided that the 94 reunion would again take place at Columbus/Ft. Benning. membership will decide at the general membership meeting where the 1996 reunion will take place. The trend to have our reunion at Columbus/Ft. Benning is understandable as that is the home of the Ranger Regiment and the Ranger Training Brigade. Many of our members who reside west of the Mississippi would like to see a national reunion take place in that part of the country. What is needed is that an individual or group of members take the initiative to coordinate a reunion Please don't ask the elected officers of your association to try and arrange a reunion 1000 miles away in a town they are not familiar with. We did that in 1990 and it required a massive amount of time and required that I make a

trip to Colorado Springs a month prior to our reunion. Approximately 65 Rangers showed up for this reunion, a small turn out in my opinion in comparison to the 185 for the 88 reunion and the 225 for the 92 reunion. So if you would like to have a reunion in various parts of the country then you need to present your recommendation to the membership and be ready to take charge and do the arrangements. I personally will attend the reunion no matter where it's held. background information above leads me into the reasons why we should attend our national reunions. We all made a commitment to each other in years past and to our association by our membership in the 75th Ranger Regiment Association. Renewing that commitment is very satisfying to say the least. We pay tribute to our dead at ceremonies, we memorialize our MIA's by naming buildings after them, we enshrine our members in the Ranger Hall of Fame, we honor our units that we all served in and by our presence show the rest of the world our commitment to each other and the Ranger spirit. We party hard and the camaraderie with the active duty Rangers has to be experienced to be understood. The examples were set during World War II by the Merrill's Marauders and the Rangers of the 1st - 6th Bn's and continued with the Korean War era Rangers and the Vietnam LURP's/Rangers and passed on to the Ranger veterans of Grenada, Panama, Iran, Iraq and Somolia and finally to the Rangers of the active duty Regiment. As long as we come together we keep alive the memories of our dead and pass on the Ranger spirit. I'll be there to not only meet the former members of my unit but to meet all of the members who at one time or another gave of themselves to their teammates, it's a bond we share and by our presence at our reunions it is renewed, year after year. BUILDINGS AND MONUMENTS

The LRSLC classroom was dedicated in the name of Laszlo Rabel, the only member of the Long Range Patrol companies and detachments to be awarded the Medal of Honor. Former commander, Dick James spoke at this dedication.


VIETNAM LURP AND RANGER RECOGNITION
