PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

This time of year brings mixed emotions and feelings to all who served in Vietnam. What should be a time of joy is often rift with mixed feelings of anger and foreboding. fights and fears, tension and stress. If you are feeling down take the time to call a former teammate or another association member. Remember that all is not as dark as it seems. Speaking of remembering..... Christmas in Vietnam. I was all of 20 years of age and for the first time away from home at Christmas in 1967. I had been in the LRRP and now LRP since October and not really looking foreword to spending. Christmas in the base camp with time on my hands to think about what I was to miss at home. My team had been in over Thanksgiving and the meal the Army served was first class, with shrimp. turkey and all the goodies Perhaps the same thing would happen at Christmas. Bob Hope would surely bring some fun and diversion on Christmas Day to Bear Cat. On the morning of Christmas eve my team was alerted to be prepared to insert at last light that day. We were going to fly through the Air in our sled of steel, known affectionately as a Huey, and leap down to the LZ, since there was no chimney in sight, or any place in all of Vietnam. I mean what would you need a chimney for. That meant a stove and more heat. Come to think of it there probably was one in some REMF spot, like Long Bien. You know the Air Conditioner is on too high. light the stove to warm the old hooch up a bit. (Probably a genius in G-2.). Just like five Santa's .but all in camo and heavily enough armed to wipe out the North Pole and all the miserable little northern. Hostile-type elves in it. if necesary. we prepared for insertion. It seemed that some genius in G-2 ('The same one with the stove) had figured out that those same elves might be moving supplies down the various bunny (OOPS ...wrong holiday) trails and they needed the Santa's from Hell to monitor those trails, just in case those elves decided to break the truce. We inserted (continued)

on a trace and moved quickly to set up for the night. In moving to our night location we crossed several well worn and heavily used trails. We set up in a bamboo thicket and settled down for our short winters nap. Sometime around 0 dark-thirty the sounds of Ox carts and those elf voices could be heard moving along the trail. We were very close, about 5 or 10 meters off the trail that they decided to use that night to move their Goodies to the other northern hostile-type elves nestled snug in their beds in Saigon. As luck would have it one of the team members, still sound asleep, decided to punctuate the pregnant silence with a well timed and loud (sure sounded loud in that quiet jungle night) snore. As his head was close to mine I quickly placed my hand over his mouth and to my surprise found several other hands already there. This noise naturally attracted the attention of the Hostile-type elves and one came quickly to see what the hell was going on. In the gray of that jungle early morning I could make him out standing directly at my feet with his weapon at port arms and looking about very slowly. There was a few bamboo between he and I and he could move no further After what seemed like forever he left and returned to the trail where, after some discussion which must have centered around what type of animal makes that unholy sound, the ox carts started moving again. With the resumption of noise on the trail my team leader leaned over to me and stared: "Barley, if he comes back again put one round through his head and we will dede." I didn't have the heart to tell him that I wasn't that good a shot and that if he did return and we had to fire it would sound like that little war had become WW II. I figured that maybe all the noise would cause the other elves to have heart attacks. Hey, if you have all that firepower why not use it? If you use it you don't have to carry it. We spent five more days watching the ox carts go by and were extracted on New Years eve. I'll never forget that Christmas eve and day in Vietnam and perhaps I received a wonderful present that night in that I did not have to waste an elf on that particular day. RICK EHRLER EXITS AIRCRAFT AT 14000 FT

OLD UGLY RANGERS STILL JUMPING

On 30 September 1995, an Airborne Assault on an LZ in Bushnell. Florida, was accomplished by 5 Rangers from the 75th Ranger Regiment, along with a former member of a Marine Recon unit in Vietnam, his son-in-law, and the son of one of the Rangers involved. The mission had a threefold objective. One, to have fun! Secondly, to get two of the Rangers. Airborne qualified. Last, but not least, to show that Rangers from different companies could work together, after so many years, and still accomplish their mission, even with a Marine involved. Rangers, Richard Ehrler (Association V.P. and Co. E (LRP) 50th Inf., Douglas Keim (A/75th-Co. D (LRRP) 17th Inf.). Terry Roderick (P/75th-A/75th-Co. D (LRRP) 17th Inf.). Frank Rhodes (P/75th), and Ross Quamoccia (G/75th) were the Rangers involved. Our friend, Richard Hunt, is a Marine Recon Vietnam veteran, who also brought his son-in-law Steve, along on the mission. Ross's son, R.M., accompanied his father, to complete our "heavy team" Rangers Ehrler and Rhodes were making their "cherry" blasts, and showed no signs of apprehension during the whole mission.....NOT !!!! Both performed beautifully, and were awarded the Army parachutist badge, by the other Airborne qualified personnel present. I might add that Richard Hunt was so moved by Ehrler's HALO entrance to the LZ, that he also presented Ehrler with a set of Navy jump wings. Hunt and Ehrler made HALO insertions, from 14,000 feet, to the LZ to secure it for the 8 man team that was to follow in two separate flights. Shortly after the LZ had been secured. Ranger Quamocchio, his point man R.M., and tail gunner, Steve made their exits from 4000 feet, and all safely landed. Soon thereafter, Keim, Rhodes. and Roderick found their way down from the Cessna 182, to the LZ, to link up with the rest of the team, already on the ground. Since there were only "friendlies" on the ground, the Ranger team decided to "Charley Mike", for now, and will be trying to "hook up" again in the near future. There is a vicious rumor circulating that Ehrler, was put into a wind tunnel and never "broke his cherry", but he has some fairly reputable witnesses that he did, indeed, "break his cherry". When Ehrler got wind of this possible mission through the P/75th news magazine, he got on the phone and made arrangements to fly from his home, in Boise. Idaho, to join the other Rangers for the mission. For those of you who haven't had the joy and privilege to know Rick, you might be interested to know that he was blinded by an RPG in 1969, while serving as a team leader in Co. E (LRP) 50th Inf., attached to the 9th Div. Rick has also been seen snow skiing, riding bicycles at speeds exceeding 50 MPH, and exiting the 34 ft, towers at Ft. Benning. We all learned something about living from Ehrler during his short stay with us, and we anxiously await his return to the "Sunshine State". TERRY RODERICK
