

BEST RANGER COMPETITION

The 14th David E. Grange BEST RANGER COMPETITION was held during 3 - 6 May 1996 at Ft. Benning. Roy Barley (President), Rick Ehrler (VP), Roy Boatman (Secretary) and Duke DuShane (past President) attended the competition on behalf of our association. Thirty Five (35) teams started the competition and eighteen (18) teams completed the competition. The competition was changed from the regular format so that not even the competitors knew what event was next. For example, the first day ussually starts with a PT test but this year all the teams were shipped to the mountain camp at Dahlonega for a land navigation test which lasted for 8 hours and then back to Benning for the rest of the competition. The competition includes events such as the land navigation course, a 10.6 mile night road march, weapons firing, rope climb and rappelling, a night land navigation course, an obstacle course, a water confidence course and a physical fitness test. The association awarded the winners a plaque in the name of Robert D. Law (MOH) and an association watch. During the competition, the officers had meetings with the other associations and with some of the Ranger Training Brigade and 75th Ranger Regiment officers concerning upcoming events. SEARCHING FOR KEN LANCASTER

As part of the trip to Vietnam I long ago decided to make a detour from the III and IV Corp area to Nha Trang in the Central Highlands in order to ask some questions about and look for information about Ken Lancaster, our first company casualty in Vietnam. After a lot of hassle arranging transportation to Nha Trang we (driver, guide and myself) left Saigon about 10 AM on March 12, 1996 via a rented car on Highway 1. To say that Highway 1 is a mess is to say little. It gives new meaning to the term Rough Road Ahead. Arriving in Nha Trang after 5 PM that day we agreed to leave at 6 am to go the village of Ninh Hung (about 6 klicks east of the coordinates given for Ken's last location) and start our inquiry there. On the 13th of March, the early morning sea breeze brought back memories of 28 years ago of those morning runs with the 40 pound sand bag rubbing the small of my back raw and the never to be forgotten painful shin splints. This time I could enjoy the breeze and cool of the early morning light. Leaving on schedule we arrived in Ninh Hung about 8 am and meet with some villagers right away. The road goes all the way thru the village now almost to the last given coordinates for Ken. While in the village we were advised that we should go to the Peoples Party headquarters for the Province to discuss what we were doing there. We did as advised. I explained why I was there and they advised me that the joint MIA task force was there in 1994 and found nothing. After some more discussion I was allowed to go to the site but had to stop and see the Province President first. As I said the road went almost to the site and the Province headquarters was on the way. Again I had to explain why I was there and again they allowed me to go to the location but assigned one of their guides to help us locate the spot. A major fact that I have not spelled out here is that there is no triple canopy jungle left in that area. The trees were all cut down in the late 1980's and the area replanted with Sugar Cane; Coconut Trees; Coffee Trees; Banana Trees, etc. This made reading the topographical maps secured from the National Archives Center quite easy with all the prominent terrain features. We were actually able to drive within 200 meters of the location and walk the rest of the way. At the site I burned incense and said some prayers for Ken. The task force had gone over the site with a fine tooth comb and found nothing. I took photos of the area for Mrs. Lancaster and left. We had to stop at the Army Garrison on the way out and again have a discussion with several officers about the MIA issue. I left 75th Association cards at all locations that I visited and stressed how important this issue is to all of us and particularly how important it is for Ken's friends and family to resolve his fate. They said they understood and pledged their cooperation. We will see. On 1 April, while on my way to Florida, I visited with Mr & Mrs Lancaster at their home in Hendersonville, NC. I gave them the photos of the area where Ken had fallen, along with the maps of the area and the remaining incense that I had burned in the valley and related to them all that had occured during the trip to Nha Trang. It was obvious that they are still in much pain from not really knowing what happened to Ken over these 28 plus years. Mr and Mrs Lancaster are truly wonderful people who deserve an answer from the governments of Vietnam and our own country as to what happened

to their son. Perhaps the near future will hold those answers as the cooperation to resolve the MIA issue continues.



Most members arrived on the tenth to get rest and perform pre-operations recon on the target site and to establish a link up with incoming members. The team secured their perimeter at a local ski lodge with a basic load of beer to sustain the operations order with the team commander Ben "babyson" Dunham. The OPORD ended at 0330 and the team ceased operations for needed shut eye. At 0'Dark Thirty the team saddled up and after inspection moved to the target site. "Gunner" Starnes maintained the position of attention with the 75th Ranger Regiment Association flag as the members placed purple streamers on the colors for the US women that had fallen in the Vietnam War.
